



Current Status for Aspire Services: (as of June 29, 2020)

- **Outpatient Counseling:** For our **Outpatient Clinics, In Home Therapy, Outreach and Therapeutic Mentoring services**, we are carefully identifying those clients who need to be seen in-person and those who can continue to use telehealth (including telephonic services). As of June 29th, all five outpatient clinics are open for in-person services. Your therapist and team will discuss with you the best way to deliver your on-going care.
- **TRACS:** Our program for teens and young adults is open for limited services as of June 29th. Staff will coordinate services with TRACS participants.
- **Peer to Peer Program:** Our peer program for adults is open for limited services as of June 29th. Staff will coordinate services with Peer to Peer participants.
- **Discovery Day Treatment Program:** Our day treatment program is closed for in-person services until further notice. Clinicians will continue to offer services and perform check-ins using telehealth.
- **Early Intervention (Step One):** Step One will resume in-person services where clinically appropriate and safe. We will continue to provide services via telehealth. Your team will discuss with you the best way to deliver your child's on-going care.
- **Behavioral Health Community Partner Program:** Our intensive case management partnership with MassHealth for members with behavioral health issues remains in service with modified procedures including telehealth contact if appropriate.
- **Adult Community Clinical Support Outreach & Residential Services:** These are 24/7 services and are critical to serve a highly vulnerable population. We continue to provide services with vigilant infection control and limits on visitors to our residences.
- **Crisis Services including Emergency Service Program, Community Stabilization Service (CCS) unit and Jail Diversion Programs:** These are 24/7 services vital to resident experiencing an urgent or crisis mental health situation. We continue to provide services in area emergency departments and at our 460 Quincy Avenue site with vigilant infection control, and can triage telephonically. Our Community Crisis Stabilization unit is operational although for the safety of our current patients, no visitors or admissions of those with COVID-19 symptoms are allowed.
- **Administrative Services** remain fully functioning to support clinical functions. We have implemented working remotely or working in staggered shifts where needed so we can further decrease our building based presence as much as possible.
